4.1 - By 2030, ensure that all girls and boys complete free, equitable and quality primary and secondary education leading to relevant and effective learning outcomes


4.2 - By 2030, ensure that all girls and boys have access to quality early childhood development, care and pre-primary education so that they are ready for primary education



Why Are We Doing this Project?

Apsara Project aims to provide education/literacy to poor children and orphan in Siem Reap province. Siem Reap is well-known for Angkor Wat, one of the outstanding tourist site in Southeast Asia; howeer, Siem Reap is also have the higest poverty rate among the city and province in Cambodia. Therefore, the accessibility to education is limited.

The specific audience of the project are poor children and orphan from the age range of 5 to 12. The project will be carried out by AIESEC IFL and AIESEC LUCT to partner with NGOs or orphanage that agree to accept the interns to work in their organizations as a teacher. The project evaluation will be executed from AIESEC side to check the Intern's experience and also the organization's experience.



The statistic map here refer to the poverty rate in Cambodia based on each region and province.

The red area present mostly on Siem Reap, which clearly illustrate that Siem Reap is facing the issue the most among other places in Cambodia.

Implementation Methodology

AIESEC will prepare and manage the projects with target of various NGOs in Siem Reap.

The project will be carried out by having interns to teach English in NGOs with the main objective to provide literacy and bring broader mindset. To support the interns, AIESEC will be integrating the them into Cambodian culture by hosting preparation seminar to help the interns to be ready. Moreover, the interns will be supported by the school to come up with teaching plans and class activities that could bring more standard education for the children and youth. During the project, AIESEC will be supporting the interns in terms of living condition and logistics support.

Teaching to Children

On weekday, interns have to teach at school or NGOs that AIESEC partner with. To ensure alignment, interns also has to follow the school's curriculum but interns can add new activities or various type of activities to engage and develop the students. Meanwhile, interns will be supported by the school or NGOs and from AIESEC in terms of preparing for class activities and lesson.

LEAD

Interns are suggested to drop by Phnom Penh City first to meet up and have a touchpoint with AIESEC side before going directly to Siem Reap.

AIESEC will guide the interns to study more about Cambodia reality and history throughout visiting remarkable places in Phnom Penh city such as Genocide Museum, Killing Fields, Royal Palace, National Museum and Underpriviledged area.
